




Each year, we capture the imagination of scores of school children. Through field trips and special outreach programming, we inspire them to delve further into history, genealogy and civics education.

Outreach Education


THE CENTER FOR ADVANCING AMERICA'S HERITAGE has been a dream of

National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution since 2001. It was conceived to be an integral component of the National Society providing patriotic and civic education for all people based on the shared heritage and the experience of our Country's Founders.

The Center consists of the SAR genealogical library, opened in September 2010, and proposed outreach education facilities yet to be completed. By incorporating the newest technologies in long distance learning, the Center will share its resources with citizens of all ages and interests. Its location in the prestigious "Museum Row" on West Main Street in downtown Louisville, Kentucky, has the added potential of attracting large numbers of tourists, which will enhance the visibility and standing of the SAR.

A big step in completing the Center was the September 2014 grand opening of the office and outreach education section of the Center building. Much work though remains to be done to complete the SAR Center project.

We have envisioned an outreach education experience that we believe will ignite imaginations and inspire a newfound appreciation for American history. We invite you to be part of our dream. CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

The SAR Foundation has been involved with fundraising for several years allowing the successful completion of the genealogical library and staff offices on the second floor of the headquarters, but the question of funding the education center with the proposed museum has been an issue that has been actively debated for the past year with many for and against. The Trustees voted at the 2016 Spring Leadership Meeting to accept the Solid Light planning document for the museum exhibits and to move ahead with fundraising for an exhibit hall. The Trustees also voted to use a portion of funds raised to pay down construction debt by \$500,000 leaving just under \$750,000 on the 5th/3rd line of credit still to be repaid. With these actions, the challenge is now before us to pay off the remainder of the construction loan and fund completion of the second floor and education center. A great deal of progress has been made, yet there is much work yet to be done.

Support for funding the museum project is based on the concept that we are ideally located to attract visitors. We are fortunate to have a presence on "Museum Row" in Louisville. It is difficult to predict how many visitors will be willing to pay to tour our center but we have a good idea of how many people attend other museums in the area and what they charge for admission. From this we can make some predictions, but the popularity of our center will depend on how attractive our exhibits are and how innovative the use of technology is in our center. It is the holograms, virtual reality and other technology that really draws visitors. Based on information that we have gathered from several sources, indications are that the project is commercially viable.

The center is to being constructed to house our outreach education programs. It will tell the story of the American Revolution and the vision of our founding fathers and mothers. It is in keeping with our desire to conduct outreach education that we will reach throughout the country, not just in Louisville. Solid Light believes it is possible that we can make parts of our exhibits accessible via the Internet to people outside Louisville. It may not be an identical experience but it would allow us to export what we have on our main floor to classrooms across America.

If we ultimately decide not to build the museum as proposed, the main floor of our building can be used for small exhibits using our own collection of artifacts or traveling exhibits that fit within our mission. It is also possible that the space could be rented as an event center. But is event rental the highest and best use for our space? What is the vision of the SAR and is it best met with an education center, a rental hall or a small exhibit space? The decision will ultimately be decided by our ability to raise funds. Your support is vital to our success. Please support our SAR Center project.

MESSAGE FROM THE CAAH CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The SAR Foundation is proud to support the programs and initiatives of the National Society. Your past and continued support is greatly appreciated and critical to the continued growth and success of our society.

Fundraising efforts over the past few years have given priority to the SAR Center for Advancing America's Heritage. The building is paying off for our outreach education programs and has provided a modern new facility for staff operations.

Construction of the genealogical library is now complete with removal of the temporary emergency exit and stairs, and construction of the librarian's office and work room. Several genealogical groups are using our library for meetings and informational sessions and our members and the public are using our library for family research.

New bathrooms on the second floor, completed in 2015, allow for a functional office area for our staff. Everyone seems pleased.

Space on the main floor is being used to host school groups. Outside groups have also shown interest with quite a bit of activity in renting space for special occasions. Outreach education activities conducted by our staff both on and off site have served over 13,000 students and adult members of the community during the 2015-2016 school year. The future potential is even greater for the complete education center when finished. The SAR Center represents a major investment and opportunity for our society to carry out its purpose of maintaining the institutions of American Freedom.

The SAR 1776 Capital Campaign, started in 2015, is designed to raise funds required to complete the education center and support other programs of the National Society. Donor recognitions include themed lapel pins and special wall mounted quills. Streamers are also available for chapter and state society recognitions

We are encouraging members to participate in the "Founders Circle", our legacy giving program. Please consider including a gift the SAR in your estate plan. Dear SAR Members and Friends:

The 2015 Annual Report summarizes income and expense for the SAR Foundation, provides balance sheet numbers, lists those who have made gifts of \$100 or more to the Foundation during 2015, and lists major contributors who have qualified to have their name placed on the Patriots Memorial Wall. We are proud to report the continued strong support by our members and friends.

Financials on the following page show a combined income for the 16 years 2000-2015 of \$11,772,871. This income is from donations from over 7,000 donors.

At the Main St. site, expenditures of \$8.48 MM have been spent on the Phase I library and Phase II education center projects since 2008. This includes purchase of the West Main Street site for \$1,452,920 and \$6,886,891 for planning, construction and furnishings. The NSSAR national trustees approved the purchase of the building and authorized contracts for demolition and construction. Approximately 2.5 million was the contract cost for the Phase I genealogical library. Approximate 3.45 million was the contract amount for the Phase II office and outreach education center.

The Fifth St. Site at our prior location on South Fourth St. was originally intended for the site of the genealogical library. Purchase of the land and buildings, and improvements made to the lot cost \$481,523. The lot was subsequently sold for a profit with the proceeds going to the National Society and used to create the Building and Outreach Education Fund. None of that money has been spent. The fund has been set aside for building maintenance and outreach education.

Development and Fund Raising expenses of \$1,909,084 have been spent over the past 16 years since 2000. The Foundation Board has minimized fundraising expenses by using volunteers but felt the need to hire the assistance of one staff person. The majority of the expenses has been for copying, postage and other office expenses. An average of 16.2% of money raised has been spent on fundraising with every attempt to keep the cost of fundraising as low as possible.

The Statement of Cash Flows and Asset Value shows contributions for the year 2015 of \$713,403, consistent with results from the prior 6 years. The performance was hurt, however, by a market correction following several years of very nice increases.

Fundraising expense for the year 2015 was \$112,651 or 15.7% of the contributions raised. Every effort is being made to keep fundraising expenses as low as possible.

Transfers to the NSSAR were made from the Foundation investment accounts according to the NSSAR bylaws for operations and from NSSAR special account funds held by the Foundation for investment purposes only.

Net assets at the end of 2015 are \$7,880,904, down \$115,192 due to a decline in investments.

We are deeply grateful to all of our SAR compatriots and friends who have provided the funds needed to complete the first two phases of the Center. With your support, we greatly enhance the impact potential of the SAR's mission. Together, we can make a difference.




